Why are these changes necessary?

We want to change the Fall admissions date from Feb 15 to June 1 – we're not able to review applications in time for the current "priority" admissions deadline, but we review each application as they come in. We've also made a change to the minimum number of credit hours—our catalog has 36 hours listed (which used to apply when we had an online MPA program), but the correct number should be 42 hours. ADDITIONAL CHANGES - 03/06/18 -

Additional changes to the curriculum were made on 03/06/18 to meet the needs of accreditation. Total minimum hours changed from 42 to 45, increasing core required courses from 24 hours to 27.

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MAJOR INFORMATION

The Public Administration mMajor offers a multi-disciplinary course of study leading to the Master of Public Administration (MPA.P.A.). The MPA.P.A. degree is designed primarily to prepare students for successful leadership roles and management careers in the public (i.e., governmental and quasi-governmental organizations) and non-profit sectors. Students enrolled in the MPA_P.A. pursue careers in local, state, or federal agencies of government, non-profit organizations, and special service districts. Additionally, the MPA, P.A. degree prepares individuals for further academic study leading to a doctorate in Public Administration, a Ph.D. in Public Policy and Administration, as well as a variety of other disciplines. Those employed in public management positions may wish to pursue the MPA, P.A. in order to broaden educational backgrounds to prepare for increased job responsibilities, or to change career paths. Such in-service students currently make up the majority of the MPA_P.A. student body.

The Public Administration mMajor also offers courses of study leading to a Graduate Certificate in Public Management (GCPM, C.P.M.) or a _ and Graduate Certificate in Nonprofit Management of Non-Governmental and Non-Profit Organizations (GCNM, C.N.M.). These options are designed for individuals who wish to acquire knowledge of public and nonprofit management theory and practices, but who do not find it necessary or feasible to pursue the MPA_PA-degree. The MPA_P.A. programMajor also serves pre-service students who have recently completed a bachelor's degree and , who wish to gain entry to a professional career track. Students admitted to the M.P.A. are not eligible for the Graduate Certificate in Public Management.

ADMISSION INFORMATION

Must meet University requirements (see Graduate Admissions), as well as requirements for admission to the major, listed below.

Admission decisions to the MPA_P.A._programMajor are based on an overall assessment of the applicant's potential for successfully completing the MPA_P.A._degree. General admission criteria include scores obtained on the Graduate Record Examination (GRE) and performance as an undergraduate.

Specific criteria includesare:

- Two letters of recommendation, one from a faculty member familiar with the applicant's academic performance
 and potential. Should the applicant be unable to provide the letter from a former professor, with the MPA.
 Delirector's approval, letters from other sources will be accepted.
- The submission of a <u>one-page</u>-career statement detailing the applicant's career goals and aspirations, including
 ways in which the applicant believes the <u>MPA M.P.A.</u> degree can help to facilitate the stated goals.
- The submission of a <u>r</u>Resume showing work experience.
- Approval by the MPA M.P.A. Admissions Committee and, if deemed necessary, an admissions interview.
- GRE is recommended with preferred scores of 60% in verbally, 25% in qQuantitative, and 4.0 in analytical writing
 AW. -This provision applies to all applicants, including those who have already completed courses in the MPA MPA
 curriculum. Regardless of GPA, those who score below the 20 percentile on either the verbal or quantitative
 sections of the GRE are required to retake the exam. -However, at the discretion of the MPA MPA faculty, it may
 be waived under certain conditions. Examples where GRE requirements may be waived include;
