

Summary of Major Revisions to the 2014-2015 USF Graduate Catalog

Policy and Curricular actions approved by USF Graduate Council May 6, 2013 through May 5, 2014

The following policies were revised and approved by Graduate Council May 7, 2013-May 5, 2014 unless otherwise noted as approved by the Office of Graduate Studies (noted as "OGS"). The specific revisions follow below by Item No. with changes noted.

1) **Admissions: Bologna Policy (2/3/14)**

Bologna Process Admissions

USF accepts applications from prospective graduate students with undergraduate degrees from countries that subscribe to the Bologna Process. Applicants with three-year degrees from universities in the European Higher Education Area (EHEA) may be considered for admission to graduate programs, at the discretion of the Department (or equivalent) and College that offer the Program and with the approval of the Office of Graduate Studies, under the following condition:

Official documentation is presented to demonstrate that a three-year degree (at least 180 ECTS) has been awarded prior to USF matriculation by an institution within the European Higher Education Area (EHEA), defined by the Bologna Declaration of 1999. Where applicable, diploma supplements should be included with transcripts and other documents required to demonstrate degree completion. An up-to-date, official listing of Bologna signatory countries may be found at www.ehea.info.

2) **Major Professors / Co-Major Professors (2/3/14)**

For both Master's and Doctoral Degree Requirements Sections:

In the event a Major Professor leaves the University (i.e., for an appointment at another university, due to retirement, etc.) and the Major Professor is willing and able to continue serving on the student's committee, the Major Professor then becomes a Co-Major Professor on the Committee and another faculty is appointed as the other Co-Major Professor. To ensure that the student can make satisfactory progress, it is important that one of the Co-Major Professors must be from the student's Department and accessible on the university campus for the student to make satisfactory progress on the thesis/dissertation. One of the Co-Major Professors must be from within the student's department.

3) **Doctoral Minimum Hours (2/3/14)**

~~Because~~ The doctoral degree is earned on the basis of advancement to doctoral candidacy status and satisfactory completion of the dissertation. The minimum number of credit hours to earn the doctorate is 72, post-bachelors, including dissertation. The minimum number of credit hours required for each individual programs is noted in the degree requirements section of the Graduate Catalog for that program listing. Some graduate programs may require more than 72 hours. the Office of Graduate Studies does not specify any minimum number of courses or credit hours that must be completed for award of the degree. However, pPrograms with formally approved concentrations must have core major requirements that all students must successfully complete. The typical minimum number of credit hours post-master's is 42, allowing for a 30 hour master's degree program. Some programs may have variations in the post-master's hours requirement, which is acceptable provided that the total minimum credit hours post-bachelors is 72 hours or greater.

Students must comply with general enrollment requirements and also institutional enrollment requirements. Up to six (6) hours of 4000-level courses may be taken as part of a planned degree program. Additional graduate credit may be earned in 4000-level courses only if specifically approved by the appropriate College Dean. Lower level undergraduate course may not be used to satisfy doctoral course requirements but may be taken to meet specific prerequisites. Students enrolled in undergraduate courses as part of a planned graduate degree program are expected to demonstrate a superior level of performance in these courses. All graduate and undergraduate courses taken as a graduate student count in the overall GPA, whether or not they count toward the minimum hours for the degree. All doctoral students must have at least one gradable (A-F) graduate course taken at USF to satisfy the GPA minimum requirements. No undergraduate course may be used to satisfy the gradable minimal course requirement for the doctoral degree.

4) **Thesis Committees (2/3/14)**

Composition

The committee will consist of either:

- 1) the major professor and at least two other members; or
- 2) two co-major professors and at least one other member

Committee members should be from the of the department or area of general research-area interest in which the degree is sought. (Colleges and Programs may require additional committee members and specify characteristics.)

(And then in the Thesis - Major Professors Section)

- Be graduate faculty, as defined by the University, from the student's Department; Faculty who do not meet this definition may serve as Co-Major Professor ~~with faculty who do~~
- Be engaged in current and sustained scholarly, creative, or research activities and have met departmental (or equivalent) requirements
- Have been approved by the Department Chair (or equivalent) to serve as a Major Professor or Co-Major Professor

(And in the Dissertation - Major Professors Section)

- Be active in scholarly pursuits as evidenced by at least one refereed publication in the last three years.
- Be graduate faculty, as defined by the University, from the student's Department; Faculty who do not meet this definition may serve as Co-Major Professor ~~with faculty who do~~
- Be engaged in current and sustained scholarly, creative, or research activities and have met departmental (or equivalent) requirements
- Have been approved by the Department Chair (or equivalent) to serve as a Major Professor or Co-Major Professor

5) **Probation (3/3/14)**

Any student who is not in good standing at the end of a semester shall be considered on probation as of the following semester. The College or Program may also place students on probation for other reasons as designated by the College or Program. Notification of probation shall be made to the student in writing by the department, with a copy to the College Dean. At the end of each probationary semester, the Department shall recommend, in writing, to the College Dean one of the following:

1. Removal of probation
2. Continued probation; OR
3. Dismissal from the degree program

Students on probation may only enroll in graduate courses (5000-7000 level) that are part of the approved degree program requirements as specified in the Graduate Catalog. Students with a GPA below 3.00 for two consecutive semesters will be prevented from registering for courses without the permission of the College Dean. The College Dean will notify the Dean of the Office of Graduate Studies in cases of academic dismissal. To be readmitted, the student will need to reapply for admission, meeting the admission criteria in place at the time. 6) **Graduate Admission Application Deadlines (3/3/14)**

The University deadlines for graduate admission are listed below. However, many academic programs and concentrations have earlier deadlines that those established by the University, or may admit only for a specific term. A few programs and concentrations may have later deadlines, if approved by the Graduate Council.

Applications must be received by the approved Graduate Program deadline. However, Graduate applications and supporting materials should be submitted well in advance of the published program deadline, especially for those applicants who are interested in being considered for assistantships, tuition waivers, and fellowships. Applicants who want to be considered for Office of Graduate Studies fellowships must have all application documents on file at USF prior to the program's application deadline OR February 15, whichever comes first. Applicants should check with the prospective Program to determine if there is an earlier deadline for consideration of fellowships the Program may offer.

7) Transfer of Credit (5/5/14)

With the approval of their graduate degree program, students may, but are not guaranteed, transfer of graduate-level structured coursework from regionally accredited institutions; this includes USF System Institutions. These courses **must have grades of B or better** to be eligible for transfer of credit. To ensure compliance with Institutional Enrollment Requirements (Residency), **up to a maximum of 49%** of a given graduate degree program's minimum hours may be transferred; these hours are reflected in the individual degree program listings in the USF Graduate Catalog in effect at the time of initial enrollment for that degree program. For doctoral programs, this percentage is based on the post-baccalaureate minimums. No coursework may be transferred that was completed five or more years prior to enrollment in the graduate degree program.

Acceptance of transfer of credit requires approval of the student's academic advisor, Graduate Program Director, College Dean or designee, and the Dean of the Office of Graduate Studies or designee. The graduate degree program / department will be responsible for evaluating, approving, and initiating the transfer using established criteria to ensure academic integrity of the coursework. This must be completed and submitted to the Office of Graduate Studies preferably in the first semester, but no later than the second semester the student is enrolled in the graduate degree program. Credits obtained from USF System Institutions will be calculated into the GPA at USF and will be noted on the transcript as the grade earned. Credits from other regionally accredited universities are not calculated into the GPA at USF.

8) Course Currency (5/5/14)

All courses, with the exception of those approved for transfer of credit, should meet the time limit specified for the degree and be academically relevant as determined by the faculty in the graduate degree program. Courses used for the graduate degree requirements can be no more than ten years old at the time the degree is conferred.

CURRICULUM

Degree Program listings in the Graduate Catalog have also been edited to include course prefix/number/title (as assigned by SCNS) and may have had additional clarification to clearly illustrate degree requirements, including concentration requirements, comprehensive exam information, and how one achieves the minimum hours required. Such edits are not new requirements, only clarification of current requirements. New, Changed, and Terminated Curriculum is listed below by College and is also included at the front of each College section in the Catalog Copy. Items in red are included in the final Catalog revisions if they cleared the pending items before final Catalog publication – most of these are noted for information and anticipated approval.
