The Council on Accreditation (COA) of Nurse Anesthesia Educational Programs requires that students accepted into entry-level programs on or after January 1, 2022 must graduate with doctoral degrees. We are replacing the masters degree program with the DNP program.

- 2. Indicate on which campus(es) the program is being offered and the extent to which the proposed termination has had or will have an impact on enrollment, enrollment planning, and/or the reallocation of resources. The program is currently offered on the Tampa campus only, by annual enrollment. The first cohort of DNP CRNA students will be enrolled in Summer 2019, and the class size is expected to be the same (50), so there will be no impact on enrollment.
- 3. Explain how the university intends to accommodate any students or faculty who are currently active in the program scheduled to be terminated. State what steps have been taken to inform students and faculty of the intent to terminate the program. Please provide the date when the teach-out plan was submitted to SACSCOC, if applicable.
  - A 'teach-out' plan was submitted and approved by the COA. The last cohort of master's students are expected to graduate in December 2020. Faculty have been involved in the planning process and participated in the communication plan with all current students. Students currently enrolled were notified in person; program plans were reviewed with the student by the academic advisor. The program plans for the masters students have not changed. Current faculty meet the SACS credentialing qualification to teach in the new DNP CRNA major and will transition to that major.
