**Subject: Distance Education and Identity Verification of Students**

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1 **I. INTRODUCTION (Purpose and Intent)**

2 Consistent with existing University of South Florida System (USF System) Regulation and  
3 Policy, the University of South Florida’s USF Health is committed to the academic honesty and  
4 integrity of its entire community, including its students. This Policy is intended to specifically  
5 complement and additionally adopt the definitions of USF System Regulation [3.027](#), Academic  
6 Integrity of Students; namely, (1) cheating; (2) plagiarism; (3) fabrication, forgery and  
7 obstruction; (4) multiple submissions; (5) complicity; (6) misconduct in research and creative  
8 endeavors; (7) computer misuse; and (8) misuse of intellectual property. This Policy also adopts  
9 the Regulation’s provision for processes to determine violations and the penalties for such  
10 violations.

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12 USF Health offers its courses through a wide variety of course delivery methods and an  
13 increasing number of courses are offered and transmitted, in whole or in part, via the worldwide  
14 web to provide enhanced availability of courses to more students. As such innovative course  
15 delivery methods are used, the potential for student cheating in coursework, on exams and tests,  
16 may also increase.

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18 We believe each member of the USF Health academic community (instructional faculty, staff  
19 and students) values the integrity of the academic experience and award of degree and so, is  
20 expected to know of and maintain standards of academic honesty and integrity. Equally as

21 important, the University is committed to maintaining, to the maximum extent possible, the  
22 privacy of student records and personal information related to that student. With the goal of  
23 assisting to achieve all these ends, this Policy is intended to clearly relate certain basic expected  
24 standards of conduct related to distance education and identity verification by both the student  
25 and the University.

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## 27 **II. DEFINITIONS**

28 For purposes of this Policy, **academic integrity** is based on honesty and respect for the  
29 education being received. **Academic honesty** includes personal completion of all academic  
30 endeavors by an individual student. **Distance education** refers to courses in which instruction  
31 occurs outside of or away from the physical campus.

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## 33 **III. APPLICATION**

34 This Policy applies to all University of South Florida System students participating in academic  
35 classes, programs and research in or associated with any USF Health-sponsored distance  
36 learning course (“course”), whether or not such student (“student”) is obtaining a degree from  
37 USF Health.

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## 39 **IV. STATEMENT OF POLICY**

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41 **A.** It is the policy of USF Health that each student is personally responsible for completing all  
42 academic assignments, participating in all classroom discourse, reviewing, working on and  
43 completing all coursework and tests or exams in each course, including distance learning  
44 courses. Enrolled students may be asked to personally verify their identity prior to

45 performing any educational assignment or assessment in a format and time to be determined  
46 by the University.

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48 **B.** To assist in verifying the identity of individual students in distance learning courses, the  
49 University may use one or more methodologies, to include a secure log-in and passcode,  
50 proctored examinations, and other or new technologies or practices that aim to verify the  
51 student's identity. Additionally, if such methods are not conclusive, the University may  
52 require the student to re-take or perform an educational assignment or assessment in the  
53 distance learning course.

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55 **C.** Each College or School within USF Health may adopt its own processes to implement this  
56 Policy that are least as restrictive as outlined and which are best suited to its needs as based  
57 on consultation with all affected groups, including faculty, staff and students. If a USF  
58 Health College or School adopts such processes, they must be submitted to the Senior Vice  
59 President for USF Health for appropriate review and approval to ensure consistency with  
60 USF Health and University requirements.

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62 **D.** Prior to implementation of any means of identity verification (except for those established  
63 methods, e.g., proctoring, electronic login and password and other methodologies available  
64 through the University's on-line learning management system), the faculty member teaching  
65 the course in which the new method is to be used will obtain review and approval by the USF  
66 Health V.P. or designee. Further, any method employed except for those established  
67 methods, e.g., proctoring, electronic login and password and other methodologies available  
68 through the University's on-line learning management system and any associated fees for the

69           use of such methodologies will be made known to students at the time of enrollment into the  
70           course.

71           **E. This Policy is additionally complementary to and must be interpreted in conjunction with**  
72           any existing USF System Policy regarding students with disabilities.
